Whereas, the West Virginia University mission statement reads that, "As a land-grant institution, the faculty, staff and students at West Virginia University commit to creating a diverse and inclusive culture that advances education, healthcare and prosperity for all by providing access and opportunity¹;" and,

Whereas, the West Virginia University Student Government Association (SGA) vision statement reads that, "To be a Student Government Association that serves the students, West Virginia University, and the state of West Virginia by;

...creating a campus that can accommodate everyone... fostering healthy lifestyles, and developing innovative partnerships with students, faculty, staff and other key stakeholders²;" and,

Whereas, The Rack: WVU Student Food Pantry vision statement reads that, "The Rack will address University food insecurity needs and provide comprehensive food insecurity education to the WVU Community³;" and,

Whereas, from 2021–2022 to 2022–2023 there was an 53.5% increase in Rack intake form submissions which highlights the rapid growth in demand for services⁴; and,

Whereas, from 2022–2023 to 2023–2024 intake form submissions remained consistently high, indicating a sustained need for resources⁵; and,

Whereas, from January 2023 to January 2025, over 15% of students who chose to utilize the Rack and Snack Rack locations across campus visited more than one location⁶; and,

Whereas, a diverse population of students use The Rack such as first-generation students, veterans, parents/caregivers, students at all levels of higher education, and multiple backgrounds; and,

Whereas, food insecurity remains a critical challenge for college students across the state, region, and country, affecting academic performance, mental health, and overall

well-being; and,

Whereas, in 2019, WISH4Campus, a cross-sectional survey to assess the prevalence of food insecurity among young adults attending a higher education institution administered on 7 higher education campuses in the Appalachian and Southern regions of the United States, found that from over 12,000 young adults attending one of the 7 participating higher education institutions 36.6% of students reporting from West Virginia University were food insecure⁷; and,

Whereas, nearly 50% of WVU students reported some level of food insecurity in the Fall 2023 National College Health Assessment Survey⁸; and,

Whereas, among food-insecure college students, 43.8% completed their college degree compared with 68.1% of food-secure college students⁹; and,

Whereas, food-insecure students are more likely than food-secure students to report a lower GPA (2.0-2.49) versus a higher GPA (3.5-4.0)¹⁰; and,

Whereas, among college students in Georgia who participated in a two-year-long survey, those who experienced food insecurity were associated with a 1.83-point increase in depression, a 3.68-point increase in anxiety, and a 2.16-point decrease in hope¹¹; and,

Whereas, by reducing food insecurity levels, students would experience improved concentration/mental health, higher retention rates, and better academic outcomes; and,

Therefore, be it proclaimed by the Student Assembly of West Virginia University:

Section 1: That the Student Government Association expresses its deep support for the services and resources provided by all WVU Student Food Pantry locations, and;
