## **Open Student Forum I**

*Mr. Lyons-* I am the director of the Office of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion. I report to VP David Farson. I've been charged with meeting with a few student groups. We've been concerned with our campus climate, and we want this to be a place that everyone can feel included and that they are heard. President Gee said that this should be a place where we can have lively debates, but it should also be a safe place where no one feels threatened or intimidated. We don't always live up to these ideals perfectly, but we wanted to give people a chance to talk to us some, get the temperature of the campus. As SGA, I'm sure you feel very empowered to speak to administration, but I'm here as an outlet to have your concerns known. We may think we know what is going on with our students, but even the best administration and faculty might miss the mark. I have some questions I'd like to ask and would you like have a very honest and frank discussion with me. Dr. Samuel Lopez was just hired, and the Director of Equity Assurance is James Goin. People should have their contact information when they find themselves in a situation that is difficult. My colleague James, when you're in the situation that you feel harassed or threatened or you need help, he's your main contact on campus. He is also the Title IX director. I will share these slides with your president and she can distribute it. I want to make it clear that I'm not here with a political agenda tonight. Because there is a real political divide, we are concerned. Some people feel, in times like that, people start doing things they wouldn't normally do. SGA, though, has been a really unifying force with things such as the solidarity circle. What are your thoughts pre-election, post-election, pre-inauguration, etc, things you actually have seen, witnessed first-hand, that you find concerning?

*VP McIntyre-* I had an incident where I was walking by Sheetz with Sen. Dixon and Sen. Waris where someone yelled at us. People shouting things out of car windows, especially when alcohol is involved, is extremely common. I know a lot of people with similar stories. You have a lot of toxicity,

*Mr. Lyons-* There is a real political divide, and sometimes, people feel like they can do things they wouldn't normally do. Do you feel a change or shift regarding the climate shift on campus?

*Sen. Waris-* from a Muslim student perspective, I'm pretty active with the Muslim Student Association, and we have 10 or 12 girls who wear the hijab who say they don't feel safe. They walked out of the library and people shouted stuff at them. We had an incident where 3 men cornered a girl and poured beer on her, and now she refuses to come back to campus. This was all pre-election. In an election that is one side or another, there are a lot of Muslim students on campus that have felt unwelcome or unsafe, but events in term of unity and the rallies that have been put on have made students feel better.

*Student-* I'm an RA, and there has been a lot more things on bulletin boards, like we mentioned on alcohol, there is a lot more shouting during quiet hours, and a lot more in the dorm turmoil.

*Mr. Lyons* – do you feel like you have adequate resources to deal with the consequences of what's coming up?

*Student-*We deal with vandalism all the same. I think vandalism is vandalism. I'm sure if we need to handle that as a separate issues, we can. We have to establish distinguishing parameters.

*Mr. Lyons-* James does more work on the Title IX side. I'm here to talk about the kind of climate and community we want to be, so we don't have to constantly try to catch up, so everyone can get along even if they don't agree with each other. If you have ideas what we should be doing proactively to address these issues. Commends to Jihad for helping establish the student social climate advisory council as one of those proactive steps to make it a good environment for everyone regardless of how you identify

*Student-* last night I was on the panel with the conversations with cops, and this is a really big topic. Many students are asking what are you doing proactively with hate crimes and stuff like that? They responded with there isn't a change in hate crimes, but that's what we should be telling people, to report it. The police need to be involved because they will take it seriously.

*Mr. Lyons-* Some incidents don't rise to the level that we consider illegal harassment, but there are still things we can do to help the victim and connect you with resources to help you deal with whatever the consequence is. Not everything is about punishment.

*Prof Klandorf-* some weeks ago, we had Milo come in, the question proposed was: when does free speech really end? Milo was slandering Professor Brewster, why wasn't he stopped at that point? At that point, it's not free speech. We've really been looked at nationally and critiqued for that. To me, he should've been stopped at that point. When does it become slander vs free speech? Trump is especially making a point that we need free speech, regardless of its content.

*Mr. Lyons-* With my understanding of university administration, most people say I can say what I want, not all speech is protected speech, while some is actually considered fighting words. I'm not the person to make the determination, that situation has really tested us not because what happened but because what it incited later was even worse. The fallout for Brewster has continued and I can't express the effect it has had him on. I don't know what went on that night, but there was a discussion to cut him off but it also could've given him a bigger platform. Our president did come out with a strong statement the following day. That personal

attack of that nature is not acceptable, even though it's free speech. Gee too was troubled.

*Prof Klandorf*- that's what you should be proactive about. If you want a speaker to come again, set restrictions and rules for them. You set the line, you're the university.

*Mr. Lyons*- there is a plan concerning free speech. I'm happy to hear your thoughts, I'm not saying I have all the answers, in fact, I want to hear yours answers and ideas.

*PPT Heeter* – add Sen Burgess to the roll via UC  
*Sen. Brewster*- second

*Sen King*- last year, you may have seen a fundraiser going on from RHA called True Blue for basketball game. In the past, in RHA, we started True Blue for basketball and partnered with the Make A Wish Association. Last year, we raised enough money to grant a wish. Starting next week, the t-shirts will be sold four days a week: Tuesday and Wednesday in the Lair and Monday and Thursday in the Towers lobby. If you want a shirt, just let me or Representative Amato know, and I can bring it to the meeting. They're only \$10 and proceeds go to Make-A-Wish.

*Sen. Ernest*- Phi Kappa Psi is having an invitational basketball tournament to help the Morgantown Children's hospital. It's \$150 per team, so if you want to play in it, let me know

*EC Fathallah*- I'm back to reiterate that there is an election. It's not too late to announce if you want to run. You can contact me, and packets are distributed this Friday. If you need a packet or want one, talk to me.

*Dir Campbell*- There is an email circulating that on Feb. 16 from 2-4 in ESB 801 and Feb 17 from 10-12 in ESB 207, there will be trainings held: this 1<sup>st</sup> hour will be training in recognizing behaviors or the second hour is active shooter training. Going back to VA shooting, mass casualties people froze in their seats and pick people off walking up and down the rows because they didn't know what to do.

### **The President's Report**

*President Merow*- There is a basketball game on Saturday at noon against Kansas State. Regarding the bike share program, we are going to schedule a meeting with Dean Farris to set up something to basically get the ball rolling for the program for future administration. We want to fill one undergrad spot in our J Court; we had someone graduate in December, so that's why the spot is vacant, so we need to fill that in case there's any violations. If anyone has noticed, we haven't donated the meals, so be on a lookout for a doodle poll. We're trying to expand it to include different departments for volunteers, and we're looking for different shelters to give food to because we have too much food for the three shelters we normally give it to.

Mac and I have a decent chunk of money left in from our campaign, so for transparency purposes, we are looking to make a donation partially to the Women's Center on campus and partially to the SGA Memorial Scholarship. We need to clean up our bylaws a little bit, there needs positions taken out. I wanted a small committee 2 interns, 2 reps, 2 execs, and present it to the committee. Later tonight, we will be bringing up a resolution to remove the Maniacs. We don't really do anything with them other than confirm their director. They're going under Athletics. I suggest someone motion to move to suspend the rules and vote on this on the first reading. Also, there is a Board of Governors meeting this Friday.

*Sen Burgess-* Today I talked with the council about getting students more involved with study abroad. I'm focusing on making it more affordable. ### **Executive Reports**

*Treasurer Daniels-* This is the second part of the report I gave last week. Last week, I focused specifically on your budget, but this week, I wanted to let you all know there are four official BoF meetings left in this administration year. Also, with the unveiling of Mountaineer, Savannah and Trevor are both in the finals. March 29 is the administration's last meeting, and that's the meeting in which there will be the changing of seats. The official last grant meeting is March 22. On March 29<sup>th</sup>, we will award student organization of the year. Last year, for grants, we spent \$103,000 and awarded \$100,000 with a difference of \$11,000 in money people left unclaimed. We've been trying to lower that number this year, so we don't have wasted money by the end of the year. If all the grants get approved, that'll be \$88,000 awarded. We have about \$40,000 left. At the rate we're going now, we're definitely going to reach that. The goal is to have 125 orgs reached. Unless there are a bunch of grants that come in last minute that are cheap, we probably won't meet that goal. Also, regarding your budgets, I want you to spend your money on something like your platform or college, but you can donate it to the grant account if you would like.

- **Title I Women's Club Ultimate Frisbee**

*Treasurer Daniels*- We're paying for only one of the registrations and entirety of their rental car because we got approval to pay for that. Originally, we were just going to grant them \$ 800 total  
*Rep*- Club sports granted us \$3400 this year, we usually get \$2500. We do fundraisers with disks sales and bake sales. We host a tournament a year, which brings in about \$1500. A USA membership is \$50 a year, and every member of the team has to have one; we go to 7 tournaments a year, and every year, every player ends up paying about 500 out of pocket. High Tide is one of the largest college tournaments in the world. It lasts about 4 weeks so colleges can make it down since it's a 3 day tournament. An average of about 3700 teams go through their program every year. Our team has attended since we've formed. We won 2015 runner ups last year, and it's a great way to interact with teams from across the country, such as teams from Harvard, Yale, Cornell, Vanderbilt, etc; we get to see them and play them. It's a lot of experience and solidifies new recruits. We're asking for team registration and enterprise rental (total cost \$1338.28); we're asking each member to pay at least \$175 out of pocket, but a week of this experience, we try to keep it cheap for them.

*Sen. Ernest*- What is the rationale for only offering 400 for transportation?

*Treasurer Daniels*- It's a mix of how much can we help the org and how much we can help all orgs. We're just trying to balance the money we have left, and BoF was most comfortable with paying \$400

*Sen. Kaska*- I would like to re-open up discussion for Ultimate Frisbee

*Sen Smith*- Second

*Sen Kaska*- Looking at the numbers, this org has been coming to all our meetings and expressing their discussion and concern

*Sen Hunt*- The cost was very minimized; they're paying out of pocket for additional expenses; this is the highest level of competition they will see

*Sen Waris*- Could Roshan tell us how we differentiate club sports from conferences?

*Treasurer Daniels*- We have no idea how many organizations will come to us in a given year. We do keep track of each organization and what they are and how much we're giving them. We consider a club-exclusive event, conference, WVU, vs. WVU inclusive event, vs nationals. We try to group them accordingly and stay within the bounds we've been going through all year and the trends that have been made and the mistakes, but it's complicated. The org has been

very informative and easy to work with, so that's why we raised the amount from last week. But every extra dollar you spend, another org won't be able to get it.

*Sen Kaska*- I amend Title I to increase the amount to \$1333.28

*PPT Heeter* – second

*PPT Heeter* – I move to reopen discussion via UC

*Sen Waris*- second

*Sen Waris* – looking through this final bill, the institute of industrial taking 7 out of 25; we can pop all of these grants or find flaws. With that logic, upping one grant would open Pandora's Box to upping other grants.

*Sen. Hunt*- With the running club, their number was much closer to the new suggested amount

*Sen. Brewster*- the running club is bringing 35 people

*Rep* – 7 to 10 tournaments a year is extremely expensive, and we have 7 on the team at any one point and we bring more to include subs, and we don't get more than 2 rooms a year, so we try to minimize costs as much as possible

*Sen Ernest*- I don't think its appropriate to compare two different grants. It's 338 and.28

*PPT Heeter* – I agree we can raise a grant, if we raised every single grant, that would be a lot of money. It puts a very big stress on the budget.

*Sen Quigley*- Doug said just \$338, but that can help a lot of grants with different grants. That can do a lot for a little. This can really help out other student orgs. We should really listen to the BoF because they do this week to week

*Rep Amato*- We already went through the whole bill and didn't raise any, then we went back to the one that we thought would be an issue

*Treasurer Daniels*- we viewed the Billiards Club as the entirety of WVU could attend this event. With the running club, that was their Nationals. That's why we suggested these amounts. I talk to these orgs every week

*Sen. Hunt*- The cost \$338 breaks down to: each member takes out like \$20, but each student is dealing with something more. That's less each that each student has to pay

*Sen Ernest*- we're discussing this grant. We have like \$38,000 remaining, but in comparison \$330 to that, any penny saved helps

*Treasurer Daniels* – we're spending \$16,000 in one meeting. Every spring, we get this overflow of grants. If we continue, we're spending close to that remaining amount in just 2 weeks

*Sen. Brewster* – I move to end discussion

*VP McIntyre* – We’re going to vote on Sen. Kaska’s motion because it’s the most constructive

*Treasurer Daniels*- we could pay for the venues (Rec), and we view this as a fundraiser, so we would like to pay for t-shirts and ask the org if they’ll put the SGA logo on it, so that’s a sponsorship  
*Rep*- we are a new org on campus; the club serves as an advocacy for people who are suffering with eating disorders. As of now, there is no in-state treatment, out of treatment isn’t covered, and one month is \$30,000, and it takes 3-6 months for a full treatment. We’re trying to make a grant to help people.

*Sen. Hunt*- We’re selling the t-shirts for fundraiser?

*Sen. Burgess*- They’re requesting \$950, why is the suggested amount only \$877.20?

*Treasurer Daniels*- we got an actual invoice

*Sen. Smith* – where is the walk held?

*Rep- Rec*

- **Title III Academy of Student Pharmacists**  
*Treasurer Daniels-* there was a bit of miscommunication regarding how many people we were covering. After working with a rep, we wanted to cover a portion of everyone's hotel cost to a conference to San Fran at \$1700
- **Title IV Model United Nations**  
*Rep – I am Brain Tomblin, president for Model UN. We are an international studies program; it's a class and a club, and includes anyone as a student at WVU. It's for political science, but open to everyone. The class helps to teach what the UN does and how to handle diplomacy that's going on an international conference, whether in DC, around the world. We're going to NY with 46 of our students. We'll be joining with over 5000 students from around the world, including Europe and Asia; and we learn skills regarding leadership, how to research, public speaking, etc. We want as many people to join Model UN as possible. We have transportation costs and individual costs. We want our students to worry about their studies, not the money. \$2500 would save each student \$50*

*Quigley-* how many people are going?  
*Treasurer Daniels-* 18
- **Title VI Billiards Club**  
*Treasurer Daniels-* They're asking for a tournament they hold here. This covers bowling and pool for members of different schools to entice more people to come
- **Title VII DECA**  
*Treasurer Daniels-* They're asking for lodging for 6 students to travel to an international competition in CA  
*Rep-* The mission of DECA is to pair students with leaders and entrepreneurs in marketing and finance. In this competition, you are assigned a case study and given 10 minutes to prepare and solve the case student; we are the only collegiate chapter in WV to, and we will be bringing 6 people and we had an internal competition within our chapter to ensure we're bringing the best people
- **Title VIII Running Club**  
*Treasurer Daniels-* We are suggesting to pay for the rental van, but we are waiting on approval for that, so that is TBD, and if we can't, we'll bring it back up
- **Title IX Student Occupational Therapy Association**  
*Treasurer Daniels-* They're requesting funds to pay for expenses to go to a national conference in Philadelphia, and they are going for multiple nights

- **Title X Japanese Club**  
*Treasurer Daniels-* They're requesting expenses to fund a Japanese cultural festival in DC. We'd be paying for half of the bus
- **Title XI Institute of Industrial and Systems Engineers**  
*Rep-*I'm the president, this is our professional chapter and club; I asked SGA for money so we could go to nationals last year. We took 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> . We got published nationally and WVU got recognition, thanks for your help before and we need help again  
*PPT Heeter-* how much did they get this year? \$875?  
*Rep-* We are requesting \$875 this year , and we're taking 25 total people  
*Sen Brewster-* what do you do to place?  
*Rep-* It's an international design competition. A student, McIntyre designed a fitbit like device that scans medical states. My design is a thermal heat that melts ice off the wheel and clears out the tread  
  
*Treasurer Daniels-* We're doing the next two together
- **Title XII Students for Trump**  
*Treasurer Daniels-* they want to bring 10-15 students to CPAC; they requested more but we felt like it was a good leverage to give \$1000 per organization for \$2000 total.  
*Rep-* we've done several fundraisers, setting up in the Free Speech Zone every week for some time last semester.

## **Open Student Forum II**

*Sen Burgess*- this Sunday, we have our next Volleyball Team. We are taking on the Swibs. We play at 8:30, if you want to see SGA win, come!

*Sen Ernest*- My last open student forum, the basketball tournament is moved to the 26<sup>th</sup>

*Dir Campbell*- Governor Justice plans on cutting \$59 million to WVU, and that is 47% of WVU's usual allocation. This is a good opportunity to open conversations about tuition increases, and other budget cuts: Marshall loses 2.9 million, and 100% of state funding to Glenville is being cut, as well as West Lib. This is an opportune time as student leaders to speak up to the University about spending money, like instead of putting money towards renovating things and building apartments, push the

money to go towards the school. Also, 100% of Promise was proposed to be cut. This is not the case until fiscal year 2018.

*Sen King*- Point of discussion – we have two empty seats in the Senate, so we should discuss if we should fill them. Also, if you want to buy one of these shirts, come see me afterwards

*Pres Merow*- we had talked earlier in this year that if spots vacant what we would do because there is more than 1 spot, but only 1 alternate, so maybe there would have to be an application, and the Senate or the Student Body would come to vote them in. There's a month and a half left- and it would have to be open to everyone

*COS Kiess*- it doesn't outline what to do in the Constitution, but that can be something to add in

*Sen Burgess*- POD we have some members that have outstretched their number of absences that the constitution allows

*Pres Merow*- a few people have been excused multiple times, but we can't make that public, but we are aware of it and dealing with it. Also, Josh Watson is working with Student Government Day at WVU for high schools around Morgantown and it's a great recruiting opportunity, so I encourage everyone to participate if you can
