Student Organization Liaison Leyden: Our idea in implementing this was to be achievable. There is no maximum requirement. We just wanted to make it achievable for everyone. Our hope is to incentivise going out and being active in our school community. I am also here as a resource for you. We also wanna be flexible .

President Pro-Tempore Olivero moved to end discussion and to table the bill until the next discussion, seconded by Senator Street.

C. SGA Budget, 2024-2025

Treasurer Leadmon: We have \$21,000 internal budget, and \$122,000 external. As a body, you can vote to move the budget around. What really matters is the bottom \$43,000 and \$122,000.

President Pro Temp Olivero: Can you explain what the internal budget is? *Treasurer Leadmon*: \$21,983. SGA is expensive. When we have special meetings

and get different things, we don't have a huge budget, so that is why it is

President Pro-Tempore Olivero: When you take out the overhead, is there a number?

Treasurer Leadmon: Yes. The number is not a lot

Thanh Le: Keep in mind that these numbers are variable. Take the BIG XII trip as an example, and all the banquets.

Treasurer Leadmon: Our internal budget has taken most of the cuts over the years. We have a very engaged body of senators. You can approve a different budget this year.

Senator Olivero: We appropriate some money from the external budget and move it to the internal budget so we can use it for our initiatives. I also think we should heavily consider how this impacts the student orgs.

President Pro-Tempore Olivero: We talked about the budget in cabinet alot today. There is a possibility that we move a small amount from the external budget to the internal budget because a lot of people would like the money for different initiatives and part of doing your job in SGA is doing these events. The internal budget is so low we may have to decline certain initiatives.

President Pro-Tempore Olivero moves to amend the budget by taking 1900 dollars from external budget and adding it to the internal budget, and opening discussion to the gallery, seconded by Senator Indominico.

Treasurer Leadmon: It is not that we don't have any money. If we move this money, we can do so many more initiatives.



Chief of Staff Risk: That much money is just a very small part of the external budget.

The events we go to are taking up a lot of our internal budget. Putting this money in our internal budget could benefit us. When you look at it as a lump sum, student orgs will still be able to request a lot of money.

President Pro-Tempore moved to vote on the amendment, seconded by Senator Street. The ayes have it, the amendment passes.

President Pro-Tempore moved to vote on the budget, seconded by Senator Indominico. The ayes have it, the budget passes.

D. FB-2024-14
