Right now it is stuck in finance and doesnt look like it will hit the house floor. Next year we will still try to expand Underwood. Travis did send me a good email about bills so I could talk to you guys. The BOG bill moves to the floor tomorrow and it will be voted on Monday. They can do floor amendments, so keep an eye on that. SB841 which regards teaching DEI topics, the state budget bill which will pass easily, The Civic Center bill just passed the house, SB474, the Governor's DEI bill passed through and will be heard in finance. SB460 failed the house floor and is dead.
