VII. Presentation from Heather Richardson, Interim Vice President for Strategic Marketing and Communications

Richardson: I have such an appreciation for what you guys do here, as I was also in SGA while I was here. Thank you all for all you do. I want to talk to you about the direction of the office of Strategic Marketing and Communications. We want to showcase what you all do as students. We are going through a time of change management which has to be approached with



care. We are focused on three things right now. We wanna get back to the basics. The communications center was a part of a lot of different things, and now we are laser focused on your stories. We are also working on revitalizing our brand. Brands usually go through rebranding every 7-8 years, and for us it has been 11. We are a very different university than we were in 2014, and we need to effectively market ourselves to this current time. As part of that you may have seen a survey from us to assess how our key audience sees us. We had about 5,000 responses, and we are currently working on that data so we can share that with you. We are also working on taking back the microphone. We want to be clear that we are a strong university and we have students here that are doing remarkable things that they can't do anywhere else. We have spent a while doing this campaign where we do one minute videos showing student stories. Hopefully you have seen some of these videos on our social media and in your emails. We see this as being key to telling everyone who we are as a university. We are putting more calories into digital marketing so we make sure we are aligned and promoting the right stories. Making sure we have the right stories to point a prospective student to is very important. Your voice matters most and I want you to know how important this is.

Senator Davis: What is the timeline for the ends product?

Richardson: We should have more comprehensive results from the survey in March, and then we will begin to get creative in the Summer and during the next academic year we will really begin to push.

College Senator Robinson: Who is the survey targeting?

Richardson: Current students, prospective students, faculty, staff, parents, counselors, K-12 resources.

College Senator Mugnano: I always love hearing about WV stories. Is there a way that SGA can help you?

Richardson: Give us good stories. Tell us when you see things you don't like or don't work.

We talked about the importance of outreach to International Students and Commuter Students and also the importance of Peer Mentorships. I met with faculty senate on Monday to present the results of my survey and they received it very well and I am working on publishing it to reach more faculty members.
